#### **Increasing Accessibility**

I am a person with an invisible disability. I have been a disability advocate for over a decade. It is important to me to make sure that Cobourg is accessible to everyone. The Accessibility for Ontarians with Disabilities Act (AODA) was created with the goal of having a completely accessible Ontario by 2025 (twenty years after it was enacted).

How does Cobourg measure up? Will we be able to meet the deadline? These are key issues that I will look into as a Councillor.

My goals for increasing accessibility will be creating more accessible spaces, making sure that there are adequate numbers of accessible public washrooms, public transit that is accessible to all those that rely on it, giving the disabled residents of Cobourg a bigger voice with assistance from the Accessibility & EDI Committees, and seeing what we can do as a municipality to offset the hardships of those that are relying on ODSP for monthly income.

#### **Environment & Sustainability**

Municipalities are on the front-lines of climate change. Municipal governments are responsible for building resiliency, protecting residents from serious climate change events, and have a longstanding responsibility for protecting public health and environment through water stewardship. These are key issues that must be on the forefront of disaster mitigation for the future.

It is important that we start thinking now about the climate issues that will be happening in the future.

Global temperatures will continue to rise for many decades as well as many other changes in weather patterns such as dangerous heatwaves, severe storms and flooding.

Is Cobourg's infrastructure sound? How many tornado warnings did we have in our area this past spring and summer? Can we handle the devastating damage that a tornado, severe storm, or flooding would cause?

We need Local Climate Action Now.

### **Attainable Housing**

We are currently living in a housing crisis in Cobourg.

We are currently living in a rental crisis and are losing rental units at an alarming rate.

Affordable Housing is important, but the need for attainable housing is greater. We need accessible shelter now, not the months and years from now that it takes to build apartment complexes and houses.

Access to shelter is an immediate need that has very few resources in our community. Emergency shelter and transitional housing is severely lacking. Affordable rental rates and availability of legal rental units is virtually nonexistent.
